Instructions to Authors

The *CIL* Editors invite submissions of manuscripts focusing on issues relevant to international legal practitioners.

The *CIL* is a bilingual (English and French) peer-reviewed journal. All manuscripts are evaluated anonymously by one member of the Editorial Board and by two anonymous external referees.

The *CIL* is comprised of five sections: Feature articles, case commentaries, up-to-date information on legislation and treaties of concern to Canadian lawyers, practice notes, and book reviews. Manuscripts should be submitted electronically to CIL@cba.org

Please note:

- 1. Only original articles will be accepted, therefore submissions should be accompanied by the author's assurance that the article has not been published elsewhere. Should the same article be accepted for publication elsewhere, the author must notify *CIL* immediately.
- 2. Manuscripts should range as follows (please include footnotes plus a 200-word (maximum) abstract:
 - Feature articles: 5,000 to 7,500 words in length
 - Case commentaries: 2,500 to 3,000 words in length, including footnotes.
 - Practice notes: 1,500 to 2,500 words in length.
 - Legal developments: 1,200 to 1,500 words in length.
 - Treaties: 1,000 to 1,300 words in length.
 - Book reviews: 1,000 to 1,300 words in length.
- 3. Authors submitting a feature article or case commentary are requested to submit their manuscript as follows: :
 - With no identifying information about the author(s) (blind);

- Include a separate title page, including the author's name, manuscript's title, and email address; and
- A curriculum vitae or respective electronic link for each author.
- 4. Authors submitting practice notes, legislative development or treaty contributions are requested to submit their manuscript including title, author's name and email address.,
- 5. The *CIL* uses the most recent edition of the *Canadian Guide to Uniform Legal Citation* (*McGill Guide*). Authors are requested to consult and follow this style.
- 6. Notification of acceptance, rejection, or need for revision are expected to be given generally within 10 weeks of receipt of the manuscript.
