

## Objects

The objects of the Canadian Bar Association – Alberta Branch are to:

- a. carry out the objects of the Canadian Bar Association, which are:
  - i. advancing the science of jurisprudence,
  - ii. promoting the administration of justice and uniformity of legislation throughout Canada so far as is consistent with the preservation of the basic systems of law in the respective provinces and territories,
  - iii. upholding the honour of the profession of the law,
  - iv. promoting the interests of its members and fostering harmonious relations, co-operation and discussion among the incorporated law societies, barristers' societies and general corporations of the Bars of the provinces and territories and the members of the Canadian Bar Association,
  - v. encouraging a high standard of legal education,
  - vi. promoting the mission of the Canadian Bar Association, and
  - vii. generally doing all things necessary to benefit the Canadian Bar Association;
- b. participate in and promote law reform;
- c. further the interests of the members of the Canadian Bar Association – Alberta Branch; and
- d. participate in and promote public legal education.
